
Learn rain barrel function, design & the workings of the new City of Reading Rain Barrel Ordinance. All City of Reading participants are eligible to enter a drawing for a free rain barrel.

The City of Reading Environmental Advisory Council, Berks County Conservation District, Reading Area Water Authority and Albright College are providing a rain barrel workshop, in order to promote the reduction of storm water flows to our sewer system and creeks.

What is a Rain Barrel?

Rain Barrels are storage containers that collect rain water from downspouts. Downspouts lead the rain water from the roof to the ground or storm sewer. Rain barrels usually consist of a plastic storage container with lid, a system that directs water into the barrel, an overflow that directs water away from the house, a screen to keep out debris, and a water spigot to which a hose can attach. The rain barrel is connected into the downspout system, in order to capture and store some of the rain water.

All participation is welcome but you must be a resident of the City of Reading to enter the drawing for a free rain barrel, donated by Berks County Conservation District. Rain barrels will be available to purchase on a first come, first serve basis.
